#### POISONS AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 2020

#### 1. Short title

These regulations may be cited as the *Poisons Amendment Regulations 2020*.

#### 2. Commencement

These regulations take effect on the day on which the *Poisons Amendment Act 2019* commences.

## 3. Principal Regulations

In these regulations, the *Poisons Regulations* 2018\* are referred to as the Principal Regulations.

### 4. Schedule 8 amended (Infringement Notice Offences)

Part 1 of Schedule 8 to the Principal Regulations is amended as follows:

(a) by omitting item 49 and substituting the following:

49. Section 83A(1) In the case of an individual, 10
In the case of a body corporate, 20

(b) by inserting after item 52 the following:

52A. Section 86E In the case of an individual, 10
In the case of a body corporate, 20
