PROCLAMATION UNDER THE ROADS AND JETTIES ACT 1935

STATUTORY RULES 2024, No. 8

I, the Governor in and over the State of Tasmania and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my proclamation made under section 52A of the *Roads and Jetties Act 1935* –

- (a) declare the part of the Midland Highway specified in Schedule 1 to this proclamation to be a limited access road; and
- (b) declare the parts of the Midland Highway specified in Schedule 2 to this proclamation as ceasing to be a limited access road; and
- (c) amend the proclamation notified in the *Gazette* as Statutory Rules 1990, No. 88 by omitting item 6 from Schedule 1 to that proclamation and substituting the following item:

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the proclamation)

This proclamation, for the purposes of section 52A of the *Roads and Jetties Act 1935* –

- (a) declares a certain portion of the Midland Highway to be a limited access road; and
- (b) declares certain portions of the Midland Highway as ceasing to be limited access roads; and
- (c) amends Statutory Rules 1990, No. 88 to set out the places of access to the limited access road; and
- (d) revokes certain proclamations.
