HYDRO-ELECTRIC CORPORATION REGULATIONS 2024

1. Short title

These regulations may be cited as the *Hydro-Electric Corporation Regulations 2024*.

2. Commencement

These regulations take effect on the day on which their making is notified in the *Gazette*.

3. Interpretation

In these regulations –

Act means the Hydro-Electric Corporation Act 1995.

4. Major power facility installed capacity

For the purposes of the definition of *major* power facility in section 8(4) of the Act –

- (a) 40 megawatts is the limit fixed by regulation for the new generating plant located at the power station listed as item 23 of Schedule 1 to the Act and commonly known as Tarraleah; and
- (b) 40 megawatts is the limit fixed by regulation for new generating plant that generates electricity by pumping water from Lake Cethana through a pipe or tunnel to an upper reservoir, in a process also known as pumped hydro energy storage; and
- (c) 300 megawatts is the limit fixed by regulation for all other forms of new generating plant.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

These regulations set, for the purposes of the *Hydro-Electric Corporation Act 1995*, the megawatt limit that, if exceeded, makes a facility a major power facility for the purposes of that Act.
